Q&A WITH KIM SMITH

WHEN DID YOU KNOW YOU WANTED TO BE AN ARTIST?

It wasn't until eleventh grade that I decided I wanted to pursue being an artist. Until then I really wanted to become some sort of scientist, but when I was in high school, I had to choose between biology and art class, and art class was my ultimate choice. And it was always my choice from there onward.

HOW DID YOU MAKE BEING AN ARTIST YOUR FULL-TIME JOB?

After high school, I went to college to learn about drawing and illustration. I spent a ton of time practicing and becoming better at both! After school I sent my work out to lots of different creative people and companies, to see if anyone was interested in hiring me to do their illustration work. Some of them were, and it grew from there!

WHAT'S YOUR FAVORITE THING TO DRAW?

I love to draw almost everything! My favorites right now are landscape pictures, kids, bears, raccoons, and dogs.

WHAT ADVICE DO YOU HAVE FOR SOMEONE WHO WANTS TO BE A PROFESSIONAL ARTIST?

Practice! Practice! Practice drawing things you love, things that are challenging to draw, and things that you don't like to draw. That way, after many years, you can become really good at drawing, and then people might pay you to do it.

WHAT WAS YOUR FAVORITE PICTURE BOOK WHEN YOU WERE A KID?

I didn't have just one—but my favorites were *The Frog Prince*, *Continued* (by Jon Scieszka and Steve Johnson), *The True Story of the Three Little Pigs* (by Jon Scieszka and Lane Smith) and *A House for Hermit Crab* (by Eric Carle).
