Review the following questions to help jump-start conversation surrounding Kristen O'Neal's *Lycanthropy and Other Chronic Illnesses*.


- Lycanthropy and Other Chronic Illnesses is a heartfelt story about friendship and living with chronic illness. What do you think O'Neal is trying to accomplish with this story?
- After her Lyme diagnosis, Priya must put her dreams of becoming a doctor on the back burner and return home. Can you relate to Priya having to adjust to a new reality?
- Priya's family desperately wants to support her, but they don't always understand her situation. Do you sympathize with Priya? With her family?





- Priya and Brigid's powerful friendship is deepened and challenged throughout the story. Do you think O'Neal was successful in conveying the depth of this bond?
- The narrative wavers between lighthearted humor and heavier subjects like debilitating diseases and the mental health implications that come with living with them. Does this fluctuating tone work for you?
